“Quality scientific talks. I found the talks in general very instructive even though pharmacology was not my field at all. The quality of the talks was really good.”

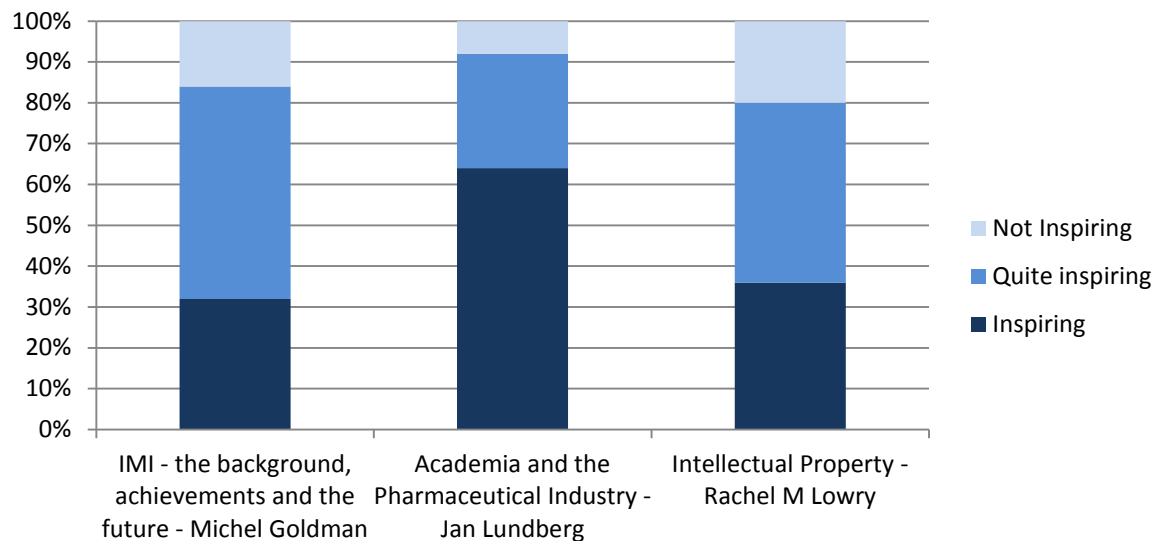
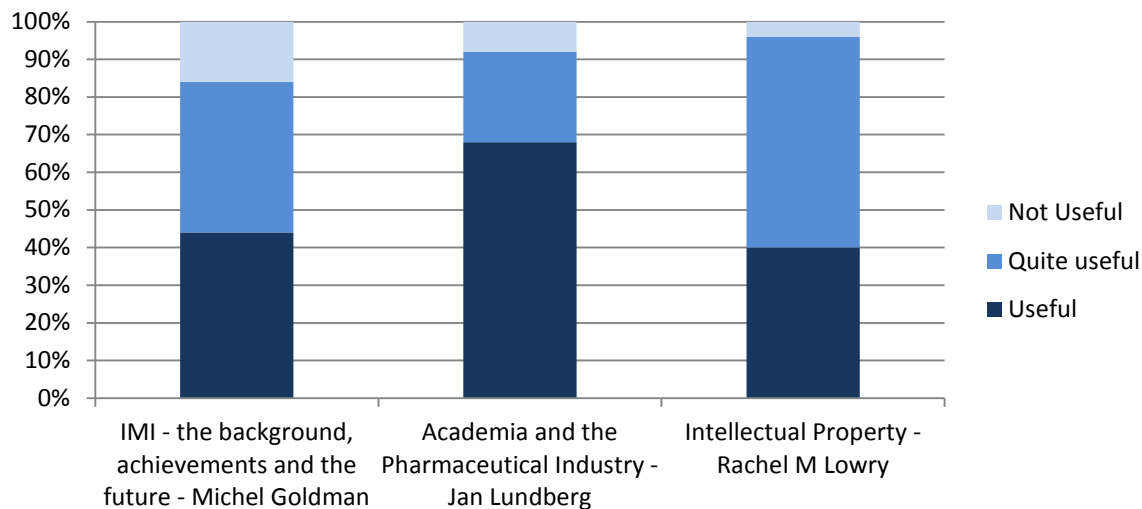

“The group dinners and round table discussions. It was very nice to be able to talk or chat informally with the faculty persons.”

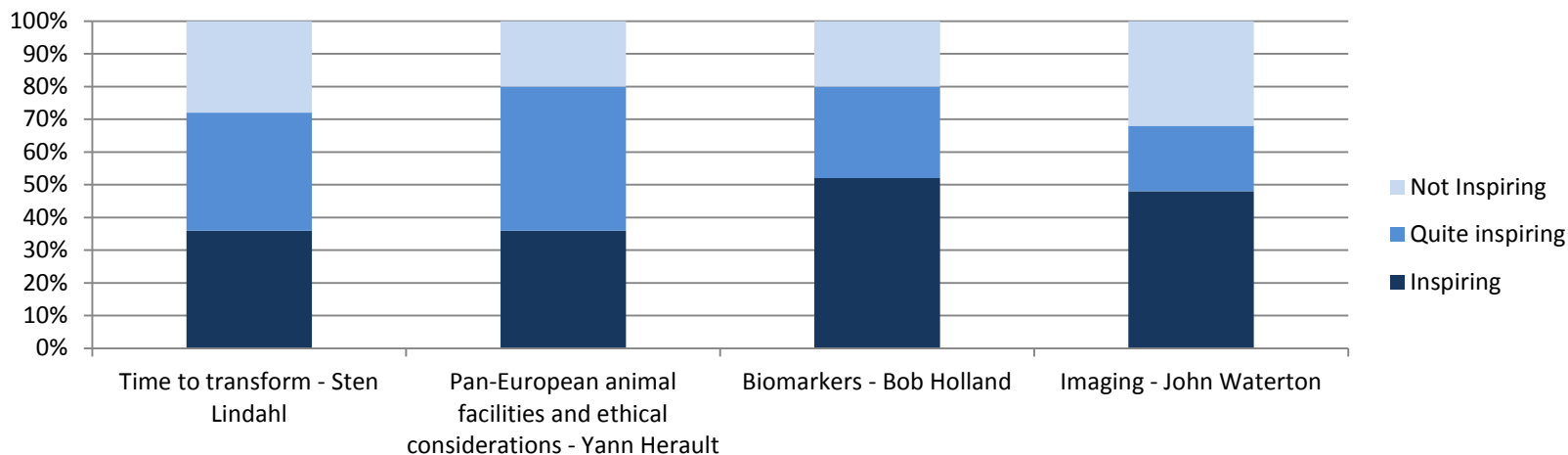
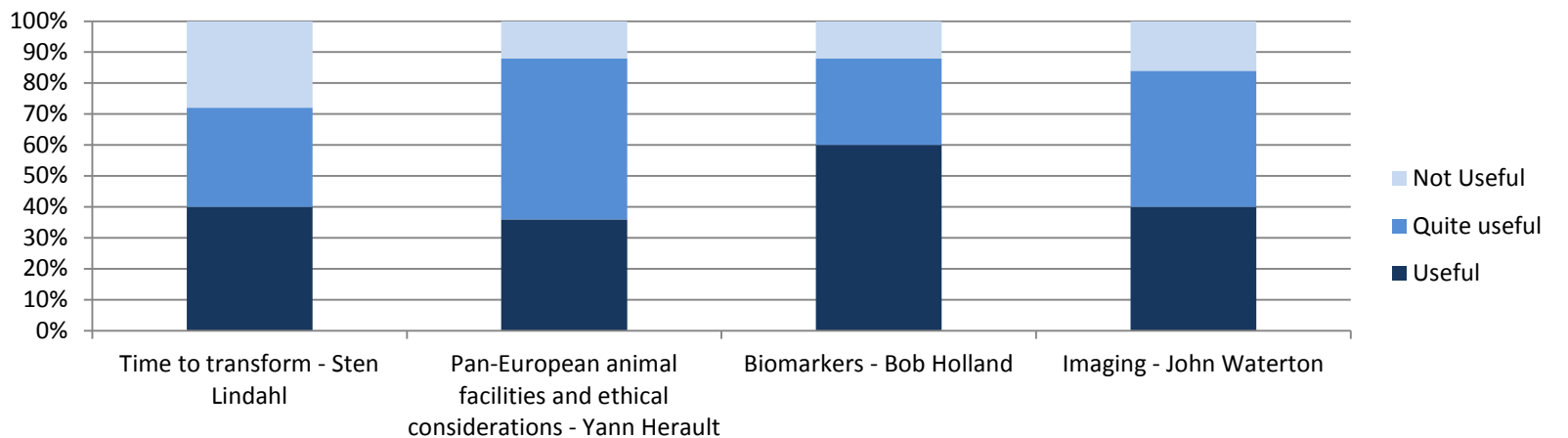

“The opportunity to discuss with senior people. The round table discussion is my favorite part.”

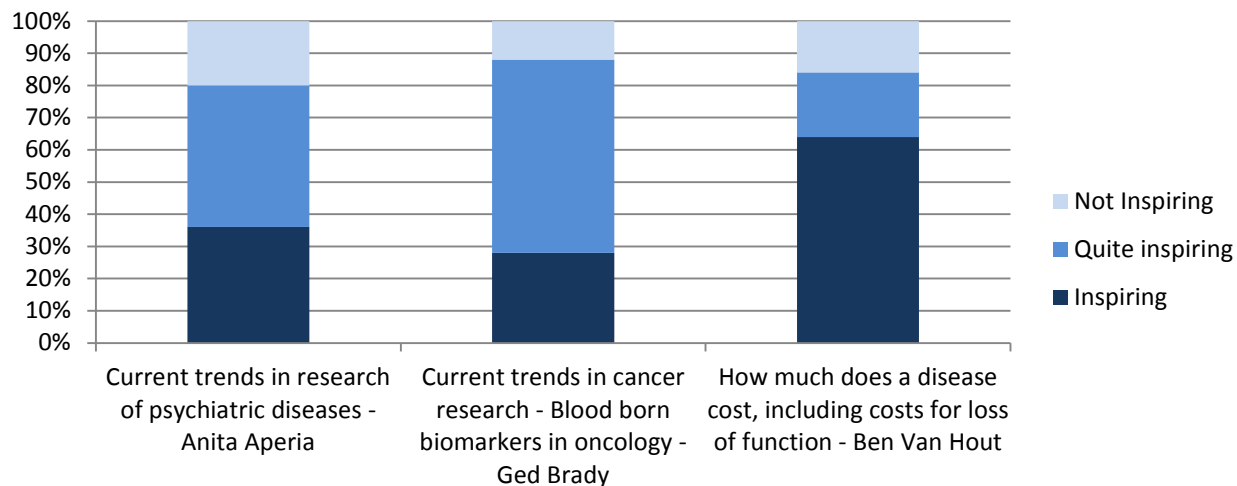
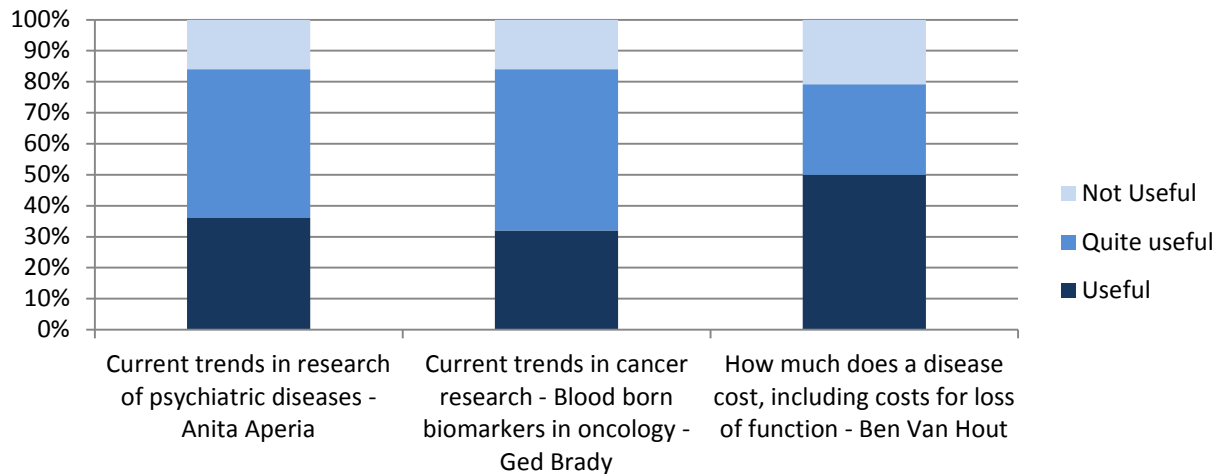
