


Please rate the usefulness of the "Drug discovery game" on day 1 – Keith Williams.

- *This was a great session.




Please rate the usefulness of the on-course® project market stall on day 3 – Claire Johnson.

- *Miss an overall introduction to the site (purpose, vision etc).




Please rate the usefulness of the "informal sessions" (dinners, breaks, etc.).

- *Definitely the best method of networking when in a relaxed and non-structured situation.


What is your overall opinion of the EMTRAIN PhD workshop?




According to your opinion, how has your awareness of drug industry increased during the workshop?




- *Exponentially. I have definitely gained more knowledge about the whole process of drug development.

- *Most of the presentations were really good quality and inspiring!


How satisfied were you with the time schedule (overall length, timing and sequence of sessions, breaks, etc.) for the workshop?

- *I didn't feel tired and could concentrate on the talks, hence the breaks must have been sufficient.




Would you be interested to participate in a future EMTRAIN PPP PhD Workshop?
